

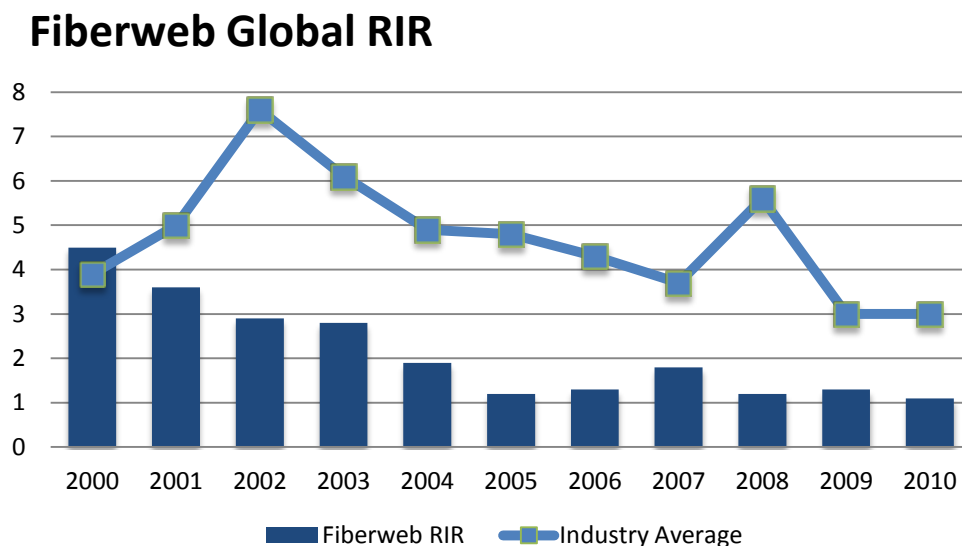
## Safety Performance Metrics

Fiberweb uses several key metrics to evaluate the health and safety performance of its facilities globally. These metrics are analysed to identify strengths in health and safety programmes and areas that need improvement.

The first metric, the Recordable Injury Rate (“RIR”), calculates the rate of recordable injuries per 100 full-time employees. In 2010, Fiberweb maintained an RIR of 1.1 which is substantially lower than the US industry average of 3.0. Furthermore, nine facilities globally had zero recordable injuries in 2010.

The second metric, the Lost Workday Case Rate (“LWCR”), calculates the number of lost workday cases per 100 full time employees. Lost workday cases include those cases that result in days away from work with or without job transfer or restriction. Fiberweb recently began using the LWCR metric to benchmark against its industry. In 2010, Fiberweb’s LWCR improved over the previous year to 0.62, which is substantially lower than the US industry average of 1.2.

The following charts compare Fiberweb’s global RIR and LWCR to the US industry averages.
